#### **Facilities**

**Lot**s happening this spring around facilities, but I will keep this brief, I am open to discussion at the meeting tomorrow.

Mayne Island legal battle – Phil has looked at the court petition and we are working towards a recommendation for our board, that we will then need to take to the Mayne Island club.

I'm working with a Councilor in Gold River to help them convert one of two underused tennis courts to pickleball. Early days and no club formed yet but based on the photo of the existing underused facility, they seem to be on a great track.

I spent quite a bit of time in Vernon with 3 of the key movers and shakers of their fabulous indoor facility. Lots to learn listening to them all. There isn't any written documentation of their process, rather a series of steps towards their goal. One of the key takeaways is how the volunteer commitment made it all possible, not just in labourers, but also in retired skilled trades people who are club members. It would be great to see more facilities like theirs, but another club embarking on such a project needs to be cautious and very open about their internal resources as well as their connection to local government.

Our long-awaited guidelines have been sent to all club presidents. A few replied in the affirmative and 3 responded with concerns. We have addressed them to the extent that we could and should and will be issuing a "next version" of this living document in the next few days.

# May 31 Membership Report

Douglas Park Pickleball is the only new club to begin operation in May. Qualicum has gone Radio Silence since receiving the setup package in March. North Shuswap is in a holding pattern too. Shawnigan Lake just popped onto our radar this week. I have removed Fuller Lake Pickleball Club from the system as they have been defunct for some time. This brings us to 88 affiliated clubs and 2 Associated organizations, up 15 Clubs from this time last year.



There were 1243 registrations in May, 535 renewals and 708 brand new PBC members. This is the first month ever that new member numbers were higher than renewals.

As of May 31st, there were 13267 Active PBC memberships, more than we had at the end of 2022 and an increase of 3258 over this point last year. There are still 2500+ members who expired in 2022 and have not yet renewed. Last year we gained 1800 new members between June 1 and the end of the year. As well, 1700 expired members renewed between June 1 and September 30<sup>th</sup> when renewals carried membership over into 2023. We could easily reach almost 16000 members this year if that growth occurs again.

No new National data has been provided to compare our results with.

### **Referee - Officiating**

- 1. The Pickleball BC/Pickleball Depot white shirts have all been distributed to our Board members. We have 2 large shirts and one double extra large remaining. David Snell has the three shirts as he is a little more centrally located for availability in the future.
- 2. We now have 20 Accredited level one referees in BC...up from 2 in January/2023. We have 19 level two referees...up from 16 in January. We still have 8 certified referees...no change.
- 3. From a refereeing perspective, the Provincials in Vernon went well. There were a few glitches on the first day or two to do with referee game assignments and WIFI reach, but the committee figured out a solution....and things went smoothly for the last few days.
- 4. On May 9, Elizabeth and I did 7 referee assessments in Tsawwassen.
- 5. On May 10, Elizabeth, Sharon MacDonald, and I did 8 referee assessments at the tournament venue in Vernon.



- 6. During the tournament, I interviewed the 10 assessment candidates that were not given a complete assessment in mid April. After discussing the previous assessment, asking them some verbal questions, and observing them while they refereed in Vernon.....I moved them along into a level one status.
- 7. Lesson learned about referee assessments!! Sharon and I have discussed how to improve the assessment procedure in the future..ie: have a referee trainer or qualified referee recommend a candidate for assessment. Some of the candidates were quite under-prepared, and it basically turned out to be a waste of time, planning, and effort. As per point #6, we will make sure that any referee that conducts an assessment in the future, will follow the Referee Assessment Form procedure.
- 8. On May 15, Elizabeth, Sharon, and I conducted a referee clinic in West Kelowna. We had 10 referees attend a two hour presentation, and practice their skills for two hours on-court.
- 9. On May 16, Elizabeth, Sharon, and I conducted a referee clinic in Kelowna. We had 15 referees attend a two hour presentation, and then practice their skills for almost 2 hours on-court.
- 10. On May 16, Elizabeth, Sharon, and I conducted a referee clinic in Penticton. We had 10 referees attend a one hour plus presentation, and then practice their skills for almost 2 hours on-court.
- 11. Another lesson learned!! In the future, we will make sure that the referees that attend a PBC referee clinic have done a basic amount of preparation to make sure they get the most out of the presentation and on-court training. Some of the attendees had not even read a rule book, completed an on-line test, or seen a pickleball score sheet.
