

Rally Point Scoring

The prime objective of using a rally point scoring system is to control the length of a game. Such games are typically first to 21, win by one, but games to 15, win by one are common for tighter time schedules.

How it works:

The team winning the rally scores a point – every rally.

If you score (win rally) when your team serves – you switch court sides. Same person continues to serve.

If you score (win rally) when THEY serve – you do NOT switch courts sides.

If you serve and lose the rally – you also lose the serve. Only one team member serves per rotation.

Service starts from court side based on score:

- even score person in right hand court serves
- odd score person in left hand court serves

The score is called as a 2 number sequence – not 3 numbers.
