

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE





INTRODUCTION

Pickleball is fun and fast-paced for recreational or competitive players. It's about social connections. It helps build active, healthy communities. Pickleball is an inexpensive pursuit for health, fitness, recreation and competition.

Pickleball as a sport strives to be welcoming, accessible and safe; to be equitable, diverse and inclusive. Pickleball Canada Organization (PCO), as the national governing body, strives to grow and develop pickleball as a player-centric and values-based sport.

Strategic Plan 2021-2023 ~ Advancing Pickleball for All, for Life sets a direction for pickleball in Canada. Effectively implemented, it will enhance and recognize pickleball leadership; connecting players, programs and places-to-play.

AIM OF THE STRATEGIC PLAN

Strategic Plan 2021-2023 ~ Advancing Pickleball for All, for Life is a framework for strategic and budget planning. It defines the focus over the next three years while identifying day-to-day operational requirements of PCO.

This Plan highlights Pickleball Canada's leadership role and conveys its value proposition.

Through accompanying operations plans, leaders will coordinate strategic initiatives and targets, report progress and measure results.

Strategic planning processes will be integrated into the fabric of Pickleball Canada Organization.

KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND LESSONS LEARNED



Pickleball Canada is making significant advances in many areas; for example:

- In 2020, Pickleball Canada Organization and Newfoundland/Labrador signed a letter of affiliation - the 10th formal agreement now in place.
- The National System - a web-based, integrated management platform for players, clubs, provinces/territories and Pickleball Canada - moving into the implementation phase.
- Best Practices Guide developed for recreational pickleball in local communities.
- Made-in-Canada, national officiating program finalized in 2020.
- Steve Deakin, a world-class player from British Columbia, became the International Ambassador for Pickleball Canada.
- PCO chairs the Interprovincial/Territorial Advisory Council (ITAC) for communication, coordination and collaboration.

Through earlier experiences, achievements and challenges, lessons have been learned:

- With the emergence of COVID-19, Pickleball Canada along with other sports organizations need to pay special attention to reducing exposure to communicable disease.
- Helping to create safe environments that are free from harassment, abuse, unethical behaviour and discrimination will be an ongoing priority.
- Rigorous processes need to set priorities, track performance and manage resources.
- A strength of pickleball is the passion its players, coaches, officials and other volunteers have for the sport. Pickleball Canada needs to build on this passion and attract more volunteers as pickleball strives to be a sport for all, for life.

SPORT DEVELOPMENT GOALS OF PICKLEBALL CANADA

The Sport Development Goals of Pickleball Canada address inclusiveness — providing Canadians and their communities with opportunities and support in five areas:

Introduction to Pickleball - To acquire the fundamental skills, knowledge and attitude to participate in organized pickleball.

Recreational Pickleball - To participate in the sport of pickleball for fun, health, social relaxation, and to experience personal development and some form of competition.

Competitive Pickleball - To systematically improve and measure performance against others in competition in a safe and ethical manner.

High Performance Pickleball - To systematically achieve world-class results at the highest levels of international competition through fair and ethical means.

Pickleball for Development - To use the sport of pickleball as a means and tool for:

- Social and economic development.
- The promotion of positive values.
- The building of healthy, active communities in Canada.

Embed a system that promotes, supports and monitors the application of *Strategic Plan 2021-2023 ~ Advancing Pickleball for All, for Life.*

Enact by-law amendments that ensure compliance with the Canada Not-for-profit Corporations Act.

Strengthen the organizational capacity of PCO.

Carry-out board and committee development, and talent management.

Ensure the effective and efficient, day-to-day functioning of PCO operation.

Strengthen our governance model by expanding volunteer and paid staff positions.

Continually strive to become an ideal national sport organization.

Know, understand and meet all eligibility requirements for Sport Canada funding.

MEASURE METRICS & MARKERS THAT WILL MEASURE RESULTS

Evidence of effective, continuing methods that integrate the Strategic Plan into the fabric of the PCO.

By-laws changes are approved by PCO membership at a special or annual general meeting.

Key staff positions identified and filled, and PCO has an effective organizational structure.

PCO Board member and committee volunteer initiatives (recruitment, orientation, support and succession planning) are in place and reviewed.

The leads within the operations and administration area are keeping the Board informed and engaged.

Transition strategy developed and initiated.

Steps identified for PCO to evolve and develop as a player centric, values-based organization. PCO is formally referenced for its progress.

Formal acknowledgement received from Sport Canada.

Execute the Long Term Player Development Plan (LTPD) for pickleball.

LTPD is effectively implemented.

Take intentional actions to move toward Equity, Diversity and Inclusion in pickleball.

Number of deliberate initiatives facilitated by PCO.

Foster a culture of Safe Pickleball.

Number of deliberate initiatives to prevent injury, harassment, abuse, discrimination and communicable disease transmission.

Approve and roll-out the National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP).

Number of Canadian pickleball coaches and coach developers who are certified by the NCCP.

Implement the National Officiating Program.

Number of Canadian officials who have gained recognition by the National Officiating Program.

Secure sustained revenue from sponsorships and other sources.

Amount of sponsorship dollars and in-kind support received by the organization.

Leverage tournaments that integrate experiential events (e.g., clinic for newcomers to the sport, showcasing of school-aged players).

Number of tournaments that have included other pickleball activities.

Contribute to, and benefit from the global development of pickleball.

Active membership in a global pickleball organization.

TAKING ACTIONS, MOVING FORWARD

Pickleball strives to be a sport for all.

Building on the passion of players and dedicated leaders across the country, we believe significant progress will be made in advancing pickleball in Canada.

Together with provincial/territorial pickleball organizations and other partners, Pickleball Canada will work to help create more opportunities and support for Canadians to play pickleball.
